This includes upper level adjectives and upper level verbs.

To do this, you may use a thesaurus or research. Websites that may be useful are google search/ synonyms.

Adjective: Describing word

Verb: Doing word

Adverb: Describes a verb, ends in ly (slowly)

Alliteration: two words that start with the same letter.




On questions 2 and 3, please draw the jug in your book with the correct amount of lines.

1 What is the volume of juice in each jug?




2 Shade the jug to show where the juice will reach.

- b) 250 ml of juice




3 Esther has a carton of apple juice.

She pours 600 ml into jug A and the rest into jug B. Shade each jug to show where the juice will reach.




How did you work out the volume of juice in jug B?

4 What is the volume of water in each bucket?




5 How much water is there in each beaker?

He pours the water into some measuring cylinders.


